



Balliol College Stipendiary Lecturership and Graduate Teaching Assistant in Pure Mathematics

Balliol College proposes to appoint one 3-hour Stipendiary Lecturer and one Graduate Teaching Assistant in Pure Mathematics, commencing in October 2025. The appointments will be for one year and may be renewable for further years.

Stipendiary Lecturer: The lecturer will be asked to teach a selection of Pure Mathematics topics from the second year of the undergraduate degree in Mathematics in small group tutorials. The lecturer may also be asked to assist with the administration of the subject, including admissions (for which they would receive additional pay), and with pastoral care of students. The successful applicant will be expected to teach an average of 3 hours a week in [full term](#). An annual stipend (currently set at £8,284) is payable. Benefits include certain common-room rights, such as a number of weekly meals.

Graduate Teaching Assistant: The GTA post will suit postgraduate research student or postdocs who are enthusiastic about developing their teaching alongside their own academic work. The GTA will help the Pure Maths Tutors at Balliol to run problems classes on first year pure maths courses (analysis and algebra), by assisting with marking and the delivery of classes. The typical teaching load will not exceed 2 hours per week, plus marking. The GTA will be paid at the hourly standard tuition rates as set by the Senior Tutors' Committee. They will also be entitled to one SCR dinner per week in [full term](#).

Application materials: Applicants should provide a letter of application supported by a curriculum vitae and indicate which position(s) they wish to be considered for. Candidates applying for the Lecturership should state which Part A courses in the [Mathematics syllabus](#) they would be willing to teach. Applicants should give the names of two referees, whom they should ask to write directly to the [College Office](#). Applications and references must reach the [College Office](#) by 5pm UK time on Friday 20 June.

It is expected that interviews will be held during the week beginning 23 June (9th week), if possible. Any prospective applicants wishing to discuss details of the post should contact [Jason Lotay](#).
